






Changing Lives

Undetected vision problems are the 4th leading health crisis afflicting children and in the United States alone, every 6.5 minutes a child permanently loses vision in one eye due to undetected amblyopia. Up to one in four children has a vision problem but often nobody, including the child, knows it. Unfortunately, children with undetected vision problems suffer tremendously in school and otherwise. Vision problems are often correctable with eyeglasses however the challenge is the accurate and reliable identification of those children with vision problems.

Since our founding, VisionQuest 20/20 has set out to revolutionize the way by which vision disorders are found in children. Replacing the 150-year old wall chart is no easy task but thus far, we have screened nearly 500,000 children using the state of the art, EyeSpy 20/20 vision screening software system. In fact, we have identified more than 100,000 children with vision disorders and worked with schools, non-profit organizations, and other partners to help assist these children.

To both broaden and deepen our impact, we will continue to be guided by the following:

- Undivided focus on our customers (the children, parents, school nurses & teachers)
- Objective & unbiased measurement of our results
- Strategic public and private partnerships
- Organizational sustainability

Accordingly, we are excited to announce that we will be seeking support to extend our works to include direct service to the community. While we will continue our work in schools, we intend to build, staff, and operate our first mobile vision clinic that will help "close the loop" by providing vision examinations and corrective eyewear to uninsured children and those without means.

We are truly thankful for the committed efforts of our volunteers, staff, Board of Directors and individuals and institutions who support our work. We look forward to continuing our work that impacts children's lives forever.

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




